PUBLIC MEETING Mollington Golf Course

Harworth Estates Investments LTD, owners of the old golf course, are keen to work constructively with residents and local partners to better understand how the Golf Course was used and how access via permissive paths into and through the Golf Course can be improved. They noted our aspirations for a traffic free walking and cycling route connecting the village to the Countess of Chester Country Park.
